Construction is well underway for our new fraternity at 3455 Holdrege! We are progressing toward an August 2021 move-in date with our grand opening celebration scheduled for Saturday, August 28. Stay tuned for more details as plans are finalized.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

After quite a bit of deliberation with the City

of Lincoln, we received our building permit to proceed. We have been fortunate to have Hampton Construction leading the way with their subcontractors getting the underfloor work and utility rerouting for the sleeping units upstairs completed on time while we waited for the permit. Without Hampton Construction pressing forward, we would not be at 20% complete.

By the time you receive this newsletter, structural steel placement will be finished and the floor for the main level should be poured. These tasks are major milestones in our project. As construction progresses in the coming months, if you are in Lincoln, be prepared to see the building look a little "worse for wear" as we reclad the building from a cement board panel to a new, bright aluminum finish.

Along with the construction, we have been finalizing the furniture, fixtures, and equipment needs for our new fraternity house. We have contracted with Dalyn Enterprises to fabricate 74 aluminum-framed loft beds and bathroom shelf storage units. Office Interiors and Design has been instrumental in developing the furniture and finish schedule. Along with the vision of fellow board member **Rick Gestring** '83, **F450**, we feel we have come up with a striking design that will serve to represent and set the tone of Alpha Gamma Sigma for years to come.

Academics remain a top focus of the active Gamma Chapter members this spring, and our undergraduate brothers are excited to move into the new chapter house this fall. 

WORKING TOWARD A COMMON GOAL

Why Eli Thomssen '56, 「77 Joined the Campaign

li Thomssen '56, Γ77 was born and raised on a family farm near Grand Island, Nebraska, and attended a one-room country school through eighth grade. "With the exception of one semester, I never had a classmate," he recalls. His social circle expanded greatly when he attended Grand Island Senior High with a graduating class of 264, and expanded again when he enrolled at UNL and joined Alpha Gamma Sigma. Eli held multiple chapter offices, including president in 1959. He was also involved in many campus organizations, including IFC, Block & Bridle, the meats judging team, and the Nebraska Human Resources Research Foundation.

Fraternity brothers helped Eli get started in what proved to be a fruitful professional career. He worked as a vacation relief sales representative on the East coast between his sophomore and junior years, and again between his junior and senior years. Eli got this job through a fraternity brother. After graduation, he worked as a sales representative for the same company, but became dissatisfied following a strike. Eli decided to find a new job and shared this desire with a fraternity brother who had just accepted a job with The Upjohn Company Animal Health Division (now part of Zoetis), and suggested Eli submit a resumé. He got the job and found that his skills translated well to the pharmaceutical industry.

"I think living in a fraternity teaches people how to solve problems by working together on teams," Eli said. For him, it turned out to be excellent preparation for the corporate world; leadership roles in Gamma chapter came with plenty of challenges because the chapter

was new at that time. There were numerous issues to address and developing strategies to meet them provided many great leadership opportunities. "I have used those experiences my entire life."

When Eli left Upjohn Animal Health after 37 years, he was Vice President, Business Development

and Strategic Planning. Eli has always had an interest in entrepreneurship, and in 2001 he teamed up with six other executives to start new life science companies. Once these companies are formed, they seek funding and hire the appropriate people to run them and proceed with product development. The goal is to find unique technologies and advance the technology to the point that the new company will be acquired by a large life science company. Eli is currently the cofounder of one of these companies and serves as the President and CEO. The company is developing a device to improve diabetic foot ulcer healing rates. He has also served on the Board of other life science start-up companies and is currently on the Board of a company developing oral vaccines for the animal health market; in the future it may pivot to human vaccines.

When Gamma Chapter raised funds for the chapter house built in 1972, Eli was happy to lend his support. He was not heavily involved with the alumni group after that until 2017, when he decided to organize a reunion. It was a success, with more than 200 attendees. Eli enjoyed reconnecting with members and alumni of all ages, which led him to joining the early stages

of *Building the Future of Gamma Chapter: The Campaign for Alpha Gamma Sigma*. He helped with the feasibility study as well as contacting early donors to ask for support.

Eli took some time off due to other commitments, then re-joined the building Board early last year. One of his accomplishments in this role was to organize a six-member team to contact alumni from the '50s, '60s, and '70s. In this role, Eli and his teammates enjoyed connecting with brothers to emphasize the need for a new fraternity house.

"I think alums owe a certain amount of time, energy, and financial support to sustain Gamma Chapter, and help strengthen the brotherhood of men today and into the future," Eli said of this effort. "That comes from a strong alumni group. Being on the building Board has been a great opportunity to get acquainted with many new faces."

The building Board is busy planning the house grand opening celebration, scheduled for August 28. Eli, who pledged three years after the chapter was colonized, looks forward to the grand opening celebration and is pleased with how far Gamma Chapter has come as a leading fraternity at UNL. "The new chapter house, along with the programs it offers to develop the skills of the members, will ensure that AGS continues as a leading fraternity, producing men who will have successful careers following graduation."
