Foundation and Trustees Work to Protect Our Home

s you read this article, the spring semester at 3455 Holdrege Street will either be coming to an end or will have just concluded. What defines a successful academic year? That depends if you are asking the members, their parents, or Mom Pat and Dad John. Your Alumni Boards would view the prior nine months as very successful. There are many reasons for the chapter's success over that time frame, but we would point to the following:

- A commitment from the senior class to be involved with the fraternity, even though most of those members live out-of-house.
- A desire to exceed the fraternity GPA goal set at the beginning of the fall semester centered on attending classes, maintaining good study habits, and taking advantage of the assets of the new chapter house.
- The depth of quality character in the new member class, which challenges all members to better themselves while also helping one another improve. This was the first class to utilize the *Aspire* program, and the feedback gained from this class is essential to further program development for all members.
- A dedicated active executive team, which oversees the daily operations of the fraternity, including an annual budget of over \$900,000.

What is the focus of the Alumni Board as we head into summer? The following items top the list:

• First and foremost, ensuring the continued success of Gamma Chapter by assisting

Sam VonSpreckelsen '21, F1150 and **Logan Lloyd '21, F1141** with securing a high-quality new member class. This isn't just a board topic; it should be a focus for all alumni.

- Continued mentoring of the active executive team, which began with a very productive active executive Alumni Board retreat in February.
- Further establishment of an "Internship and Employment" platform, which allows Gamma alumni to directly share employment opportunities with members.
- Working with the Gamma Foundation board to provide timely information to all alumni regarding how the Alumni Association and Gamma Foundation continue to carry out their mission through the financial support of our alumni.

Of special note is a topic affecting the entire Greek system at UNL and Nebraska Wesleyan. The Lancaster County Assessor last reviewed property valuations of fraternities and sororities in 2015. That changed in 2022, and they recently released their "preliminary" valuations. The effect on the "newer" fraternities is alarming. The valuation for AGS increased from \$2.7 million to \$4 million—which equates to an additional \$24,000 of property tax (\$51,000 to \$75,000). We met with the assessor to contest and presented various restrictions that we believe challenge the value.

While our valuation increase (48%) is extremely challenging and would result in raising the active chapter's rent to offset (equating to \$350/member), the increases to the other east campus fraternities were astounding. AGR and FarmHouse have also met with the assessor to protest the preliminary valuations, and once we all learn of our final valuations, we plan to reconnect and possibly hire legal counsel. We also plan to work alongside IFC to file a protest on behalf of all fraternities and sororities with the County Clerk (the filing deadline is June 30).

Alumni Stay in Touch through Annual Pheasant Hunt

Young friendships bound in the Alpha Gamma Sigma brotherhood are worth continuing. For eight years, a group of Gamma brothers has kept in touch through the thrill of the hunt and connecting each January for an annual get-together.

The brothers united in January 2023 for their seventh annual pheasant hunt (with only one year canceled for inclement weather). The event is a group effort, hosted each year in Beatrice, Nebraska, at Cub Creek Hunting—a family business owned and operated by **Troy Cammack '80, I408** and his wife, Mary.

"We opened in 2001, looking for something to supplement our farming income; Troy has always been an avid hunter," Mary said. "We enjoy meeting all the different people that hunt with us—some of whom come back each year."

Brothers take turns each year with event planning and organization. This year, **Mike Zalman '87, Г524** helped to start the event planning while **Dave Hicks '87, Г519** sponsored their traditional lodging at the Hicks Ranch.

"We do one of our European hunts, which consists of 225 birds released to 16 shooters," Troy explained. "The spots are filled with older AGS alumni to brothers who have just graduated in the past year or two."

After a rewarding hunt, everyone returns to Cub Creek to enjoy desserts and an open bar while the birds are cleaned. The brothers each return home with a dozen or more clean pheasant breasts to enjoy.

"It's always a joy to get together and catch up on our lives, discussing our families and current events as well as reliving the old days," Mike said. "Sometimes, the original stories magnify themselves with time—and are that much more enjoyable as we age."

"We enjoy having the AGS group out each year," Mary said. "You can see that they have remained in touch as much as possible since graduating from UNL and thoroughly value their fraternity brothers' friendship."

"The bonds of brotherhood last a lifetime," Dave said. "We can see one of our brothers daily, or we could not see one for 30 years—and you pick up right where you left off and love them like you always have."


