Increased Alumni Support Vital to Reaching Campaign Goal

Let's Write Gamma's Next Chapter Together

Since Alpha Gamma Sigma's *Building the Future of Gamma Chapter: The Campaign for Alpha Gamma Sigma* began, we have had several communication updates to keep you apprised of our project. We are excited to announce we have hired Alley Poyner Macchietto Architecture (APMA) and Hampton Construction. The board feels confident after doing our research and due diligence that these will be great partners to work with. Above, you'll see an updated rendering from APMA.

This is an exciting update and direction we are moving toward; however, we need to raise more funds to begin construction in May 2020 and secure Gamma Chapter's future at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Mutual Assistance Begets More

To date, 119 brothers have committed \$1,546,910 to the campaign. This represents just 16.6% of our members participating. The average rate of participation for a successful Greek capital campaign is around 25%, and the highest at UNL is 38%. Imagine what we could accomplish if twice as many alumni pledged their support to Gamma Chapter.

Many hands make light work, and with the support of additional Alpha Gamma Sigma alumni, we are confident we will reach our goals. We would be honored to add your name to the list of donors helping us do so. Consider a commitment of \$5,000 or \$2,500, payable over the next five years, to help us achieve our \$2.5 million goal and put Gamma on solid financial ground. **It's imperative we reach \$2.5 million pledged by May 2020 to begin construction on time.**

However, $A\Gamma\Sigma$ stood out among the rest. Ultimately, it was the commonality he felt with the brothers and the home-like feel of the chapter house that solidified

his decision to join Gamma Chapter. Without Alpha Gamma Sigma, Bob would not have the life he has today.

"Gamma Chapter provided me with a lot of guidance, enforced study hours, and assisted in a better understanding of how the university system worked," Bob said. "It did so much for me—it helped me get through college and start a good career."

He served two years driving for the Southern Command Surgeon General at the Canal Zone in Panama. Millard went to Jungle Training School and non-commissioned officer training school to help make rank and went back to the farm for 13 years, leaving in the mid-1980s due to the agriculture crisis. He then started working as a loan officer for Producers Livestock Credit Corporation in Omaha. In his position, he financed livestock for farmers and feedlots in a 10-state area, in addition to providing hedges, options, and other forms of risk management. During that time, Millard served as a judge for the FFA at their state convention in Lincoln.
