


ALUMNI EVENT RECAP





A Worthy Cause

HOW GERARD KEATING '82, Г437 SUPPORTS AGS

"I can't imagine a better investment than supporting young people who want to make themselves better."

A lpha Gamma Sigma and the lifelong friendships it sparked made Gerard Keating '82, Γ437 a better person. His favorite fraternity memory came 40 years after he joined: when Gamma Chapter dedicated its new home in 2022.

"A lot of people look backward, talking about the 'glory days," Gerard said. "That's not who I am. I'm always about the future, and joining this project to create opportunities for our future leaders was a satisfying endeavor." Gerard was proud to honor Gamma Chapter's 70th anniversary by co-chairing the campaign for a new chapter house, which will prepare AGS for 70 more years in Lincoln.

Gerard has participated in many nonprofit efforts, but none have matched the diversity and history of Alpha Gamma Sigma. "I'd ask my fraternity brothers: if we don't help build leaders in agriculture (and in general), who is going to do it? That's why I choose to give to programs led by people that I know and trust," he said. "I can't imagine a better investment than supporting young people who want to make themselves better."

Gerard founded Keating Resources in 2004 after a successful career with a corporate real estate entity in Chicago. His son, Alec, is now a partner in the family-based company, which recently celebrated its 20th anniversary. Above all, Gerard is proud of his two children (Alec and his daughter, Reese) and his efforts to stay connected with family and friends throughout his life. "Maintaining relationships takes work and effort, but it's so rewarding."

People and connections are the greatest gifts in Gerard's life, and he enjoys any opportunity to travel and meet new people in the places they love. When he travels for work, he tries to visit any nearby fraternity brothers (and call others when possible). He also tries to

visit Lincoln once a year to connect with the local brotherhood. "It's a real blessing when we can all be together at certain events."

At age 60, Gerard is living his best life and believes AGS helped him (like many others) live up to his potential. "I strongly encourage brothers of all ages to give financially to the fraternity for causes that are important to the giver," he said. "Whether that's leadership programs, improvements to the house, etc., the return is very rewarding."

BRT 2024 was a great success. If you couldn't make the meetings or BRT in 2024, we hope you can attend next year!





Aspire to Associa INAUGURAL EVENT A HUGE SUCCESS

n September 6, Gamma Chapter launched the inaugural **Aspire to Associate** event to rave reviews from the undergraduates. The content was created to support their pursuit to "Be the Best Man You Can Be" through a series of development sessions designed uniquely to meet the needs of this generation of men.

The event included three development sessions, Present Your Best You, Live Your Best Life, and Be Your Best You, which were led by a team of alumni members with established career experience and expertise related to the session content. The sessions were co-facilitated with the support of the undergraduate's fraternity education committee members and Gavin Dozler '22, Γ1166, fraternity educator.

Session topics included tips on behavioral interviewing, how to make a great first impression, networking, how values, beliefs, and principles guide the pursuit of purpose, and the importance of mental, physical, spiritual, and financial well-being. The headline event was a luncheon that featured keynote speaker Lindsay Hastings, Clifton professor of mentoring research at UNL and wife of Matt '01, Γ780.
